65 Cattle included 57 prime cattle of very mixed quality. Best handyweight cattle meeting the strongest demand with a good percentage of those forward which helped the selling. Also good to see old faces return to the ring **BUT** this trade is still well below economic levels. Top this week 217.5pkg for A & W Bentall from a smart lightweight steer and purchased by Messrs Fowler Bros, Burnham on Crouch. Tony Evans 212.5pkg for another smart Limousin X steer and purchased by George Debman, Ipswich, for his shop. Les Carr had 211.5pkg and Messrs Peppers Farm 213.5pkg paid by George Blackwell, the same vendor having 209.5pkg and 208.5pkg. Peter Walker steer to 207.5pkg, Andrew Watt steer to 204.5pkg, K Speakman Ltd heifers to 206.5, 205.5pkg etc. The Bentalls had bulls to 209.5pkg with other steers to 209.5, 208.5pkg (2). Cattle 'R' grade 185 to 201.5pkg with poor conformation sorts very difficult 119.5 to 130.5pkg. Bulls saw Hereford to 174.5pkg. A run of Holsteins 145.5 from 101.5pkg reflecting shape and finish. Top price per head from M Bates at £1,421.28 for steers and £1,358.72 from the same vendor.
