All lambs of all weights averaged £92.81, a remarkable average for the time of year. This included several lean small lambs around 200pkg with the store trade underpinning this trade. Several runs of good strong lambs forward to a top of £129 a head from Richardson Bros who had other pens at £116, £115 and £114. A Bryce to £124, £120, £117 etc, E J & C V Fenton to £116, £109 etc, Anchor Farms Ltd to £104, £103.50. W & J Griffin run of quality 42 to 46kg lambs to £112.00, £106.50, £103.50 etc and Easton College to £113, £112. Hollington Farms to £104.50, Hagag saw medium weight lambs to £100.
